urban practices, considering recent and on-going demographic, political and socio-economic changes. The work of sociologist Zygmunt Bauman and the political theories of Chantal Mouffe are employed as an approach to contextualize the practice within the increasing complexity of urban areas and societies now experiencing a 'liquid modern state'. This contextual landscape serves as an incubating milieu for decentralized and participatory practices, including tactical urbanism, which is the subject of this study. Based on a variety of case studies and made up of a combination of text sources, interviews and first hand experiences, the purpose of this inquiry is to find a place for tactical urbanism through evaluation and critique. The concluding remarks find that the current state of tactical urbanism is challenged by the ease of its co-optation as well as its own self-limiting intentions. This study suggests that the practice's characteristic playfulness and, often, its superficiality, may have more serious consequences for the broader public conceptualization of democratic processes and activism as we traditionally understand it. However, it speculates that our conception of 'real activism' is an obsolete ideal, which shares the same limitations as the top-down systems directly challenged by the practice.
